Dear Library Development Professionals,

This past year has been one of remarkable change — for me personally, and for the Library Support Network. In June 2024, I stepped down from my role as CEO of the Seattle Public Library Foundation to focus full-time on building the future of this community we've created together.

As of September, the Library Support Network became a **501(c)(3) nonprofit organization**. While the Seattle Public Library Foundation remains our fiscal sponsor until we receive our tax exemption certificate, this formal step signals something important — the momentum we've built isn't slowing down. It's accelerating.

In addition to our vibrant monthly convenings, this year we brought the highest-rated content from the International Public Library Fundraising Conference directly to the community through webinars, offered a specialized training series with the National Conflict Resolution Center, and launched Small Shop Sessions designed specifically for those doing this work with limited staff and resources. These additions reflect what you've asked for — more access, more resources, and more connection.

Thanks to a planning grant from the Mellon Foundation, we've begun a thoughtful process of strategic and business planning for LSN's long-term sustainability. We're also deeply grateful for the continued support of the Knight Foundation and the 28 libraries and library foundations who have invested in this network's future. **Your belief in our shared work is what powers everything we do**.

As the landscape for public libraries continues to evolve, library fundraising professionals are being asked to do more to secure support — which requires us to communicate value, build stronger cases for support, and forge deeper relationships with donors and stakeholders.

You are the bridge between your library's vision and the resources needed to realize it. Whether you're launching a new campaign, navigating a complex donor conversation, or building a fundraising program from scratch, the LSN is here to connect, equip, and uplift you. Together, **we are building a stronger, more resilient future for public library fundraising** — one that reflects the strength of our shared commitment and the power of our collective knowledge.



742 people have joined the LSN Community since 2022. 219 people joined in 2024.

MEMBER RETENTION IS STRONG

New Member 30 Day Retention Rate



38% of new members returned within 30–60 days of joining which is a strong baseline to measure our new welcome series against.

Existing Members 30 Days Retention Rate



82% of previously active members revisited the platform in the past 30 days. This is an excellent sign.



MEMBER ACTIVITIES

The LSN Community has created many new opportunities for professional development and connection, filling a gap in our sector.



11 convenings were held with an average of 42 members joining live to check in and discuss timely topics.



Four top-rated IPLFC presentations were repeated and recorded for deep learning and future reference.



New affinity groups launched this year, including our first Small Shop Sessions for fundraisers leading lean teams.
